Consistently outstanding results over the last five years sees Central Coast Grammar School once again celebrate the achievements of its Year 12 students in the Higher School Certificate and the International Baccalaureate.

Individual Achievements

While our Higher School Certificate students celebrated their excellent results before Christmas, the International Baccalaureate (IB) students, representing 20% of the cohort, had the long wait until 4 January before their results were released. They were rewarded for their patience with the majority receiving an ATAR in excess of 90.

"I am absolutely delighted with the performance of Central Coast Grammar School students in the 2010 HSC and IB," said Headmaster, William Low. "The School has a proud tradition of academic excellence and there has been a considerable increase in the number of students achieving Band 6 HSC / IB (equivalent) results in one or more subjects this year. This has been a strong focus for CCGS in 2010 and now 60% of our students have achieved that goal."
